Meeting People Where They Are At

Before I stepped inside Fontbonne, it was just a building I passed on my walks through the neighbourhood. Today, I work full-time at our Queen Street East location. Every day, I witness firsthand the strength and beauty of this community, and I am deeply honoured to be part of it.

As one of two drop-in coordinators, a critical component of my role is to support and engage with all participants from the time we open for our breakfast program until we close the doors in the afternoon. I know that every interaction can impact someone's day, so I consciously try to remember people's coffee orders and their names. It helps spark a relationship that starts their day off on a positive note, even if things hadn't been going well before they arrived.

One of my responsibilities is managing the clothing boutique, where our participants can browse for clothing and hygiene products like soap and toothpaste. The boutique allows people to choose what best suits them, preserving their dignity and boosting their self-esteem.

But my role extends beyond breakfast and clothing; I'm a resource for participants who need help connecting to other services. I help navigate forms for programs like the Canadian dental benefits, guide them through housing applications, and try to connect them to other organizations with services that complement our offerings. And, very occasionally, I need to assist someone who has been hurt or who needs harm reduction services.

Every day, I witness the challenges our participants face. Many are affected by the rising cost of living, food insecurity, and housing instability. Some are on disability insurance or living with mental health challenges. Despite their struggles, our participants create a network of care and generosity. They are always willing to share regardless of what little they might have. It's an inspiring web of community support that turns Fontbonne from just a drop-in space to a true family.

Meet Shane and Melissa

S hane and Melissa have been part of the Fontbonne community for over a year, and their presence has become a cherished part of our drop-in space. They live in the community with their 3-year-old daughter, Melina Grase, and their dog, Teddy.

"We were told it was a place we could go to get meals and clothes, but we quickly discovered it was much more than that," Shane shares. "The staff and volunteers are helpful and don't judge or turn away anybody who comes through the doors."

Melissa echoes Shane's sentiment: "Everyone always has a smile. It is such a welcoming environment; no other place in the city compares. The staff connect us to other resources, and we can even get haircuts from professional stylists here."

Both Shane and Melissa live with disabilities that add layers of challenge to their daily lives.

"I have scoliosis and fibromyalgia, so I need wheelchair-accessible housing," Melissa says. "Rent has gone up while our benefits from ODSP (Ontario Disability Support Program) have gone "We struggle the last two weeks of the month.
